The Play

Judy is a picture-perfect 50s housewife. She spends her days making the perfect devilled eggs, mixing the perfect Screwdriver and being the perfect homemaker to her husband Johnny. They're totally happy with their pastel-hued life. The only problem is, it's not the 1950s, it's now, and their dream world is about to come crashing down in hilarious style. In Laura Wade's smart and engaging *Home, I'm Darling*, nostalgia isn't what it used to be ...and it constantly collides with present-day realities.

Winner of the 2019 Olivier Award for Best New Comedy, *Home, I'm Darling* is full of big laughs, big skirts and big questions. How can we cope with the pressures of modern life? What do we lose in the present when we pine for the past? And can you get stains out of a shirt with just lemon juice and baking soda? This witty, highly original and thought-provoking comedy takes a look at the complexity of women's choices and the dangers of nostalgia through distinctly rose-coloured glasses. Full of playful, breezy charm, it also packs a considerable punch.

The Playwright

Laura Wade

Laura Wade (born 16/10/77) is a playwright and screenwriter. Her recent plays include *The Watsons* and *Home, I'm Darling* (National Theatre), which won the 2019 Olivier Award for Best New Comedy. Film work includes *The Riot Club*, adapted from her play *Posh*. Laura's playwriting career began at the Crucible Theatre in Sheffield, and developed at the Royal Court Theatre Young Writers Programme and Soho Theatre's Writer Attachment scheme.

Laura's plays have been performed in many countries, including New Zealand, the US, Australia, Germany, Mexico, Sweden, Slovenia and France. She is developing a feature film with support from the BFI Film Fund, and made her broadcasting debut in February 2020 as presenter of the new BBC Radio 4 narrative history series *Equal As We Are*.


