FROM THE DIRECTOR

There is a theory of comedy that says that comedy can come from "commitment to 'a bit". The bit can be an idea. A twist. Or, in our case, character. You take "the bit", and play it over and over, and keep playing it to just over 100%, and see what happens when a bit of our world is exaggerated into the wonderful world of absurdity.

Renovations for Six brings together three couples who are each of distinct strong character ... who absolutely should not be in a room together for any period of time. And Norm Foster's brilliance in his scripts is from taking these highly recognisable, only very slightly exaggerated characters, and winding them up and letting the comedy machine run and do its thing. It's a directing juggle figuring out how the bits fit into that machine, but enormously rewarding as they click together.

And so many bits! The couples, played by both familiar and new HLT faces, have crafted their incredible couples together and it's been a privilege to watch them push their commitment to the characters further than I had any right to expect. The crew's unending commitment has given us a fun and believable world to play in, and HLT's commitment to quality has supported us in bringing this one to vivid life.

I thank everyone involved for their work, and particularly the theatre management team for their support and Sho, my stage manager, and Carolyn, my production coordinator, for creating a smoothly running space for me to direct after a long break. The literal thousands of volunteer hours from that very long list of cast and crew that go into each show often pass unnoticed, and I invite you to recognise the efforts of all of them.

It turns out it takes lots of bits of remarkable craft to make "the bit". Enjoy their commitment!

ANDREW JOHNSON

Director

Andrew (AJ) is a regular on the HLT stage, and thrilled to be directing after a 20-year break. He assistant-directed *Aurélia* at HLT last year and directed or co-directed numerous shows over a decade as a life member of the University of Canterbury Drama Society, including *Romeo and Juliet*, *Shakespeare Who?* and *Albuquerque Jones and the Raiders of the Lost Script*, which he also co-wrote. Between voice acting and recording audiobooks, stage and occasional screen appearances, improvising at Covert Theatre, and photography gigs, he can often be found teaching Media Studies to senior secondary school students.



BARRIE GRAHAM

Wing Falterman

Having had the privilege of reading *Renovations for Six* at HLT's Preeves Night late last year, Barrie was keen to take on the role of Wing formally, and was delighted to get the part. It's a welcome change from the assorted coppers and inspectors he's played in various whodunits at HLT and Dolphin in recent years, and represents a reversion to comedy, which was always his first theatre love since his first outing at HLT in 2008, and Cornwall Players before that. While first and foremost a comedy, *Renovations* traverses a number of themes of various degrees of poignancy. Ladies, bring tissues, and be aware that there may be odd bouts of intemperate language. Outside theatre, Barrie continues to ply his trade at the BNZ – in some ways not a lot different to Wing flogging sofas and tellies at Harvey Norman under the guise of "making customers happy". He hopes you enjoy the show – it's certainly garnered a lot of laughs during rehearsals.

Let's just say she's never looked back. Her last adventure at HLT was in 2018's *Good People*, and her most recent was *Steel Magnolias* at Papakura Theatre in 2021.

Not that she is anything like Billie ... with her propensity to over-dramatise, seek out the limelight and dance through life. And it's just totally coincidental that she and hubby will be embarking on a few renovations after recently becoming empty nesters themselves. So ... nope, nothing like Billie ... at all.

She is looking forward to working with this wonderful and possibly slightly deranged bunch of people on stage and behind the scenes all of whom are volunteers and club members. The magic just doesn't happen without each and every one of them. So, Ngaire-Ann hopes you enjoy this play as much as she and the team do.









THE PLAY

Newly arrived to the city and keen to make new friends, Shayna and Grant Perkins invite their neighbours around to their half-finished home for dinner. Former showbiz couple the Faltermans are a seemingly idyllic pairing, while the psychiatrist Veronica Dunn-Dudet and her engineer-turned-novelist husband appear anything but. In between multiple drinks and slightly burnt spring rolls, things quickly become awkward as hilariously unexpected truths emerge. *Renovations for Six* was first produced by the Foster Festival in St Catharines, Ontario, Canada, in August 2017.

THE PLAYWRIGHT

Norman Foster, OC, (born February 14, 1949) has been the most-produced playwright in Canada every year for the past 20 years. His plays receive an average of 150 productions annually. Norm has over 60 plays to his credit, including *The Foursome, On a First Name Basis*, and *Hilda's Yard*. He also acts, often in his own work. Norm is the recipient of the Los Angeles Drama-Logue Award for his play *The Melville Boys* and in 2016 was made an Officer of the Order of Canada.

Foster discovered his talents as a playwright in Fredericton, New Brunswick, while he was working as host of a popular morning radio show. Intrigued with the theatre, he set his pen to paper and wrote his first play, *Sinners*.

In 1983 and 1984, Theatre New Brunswick mounted the first professional productions

of Sinners and his next play The Melville Boys. In the years following, TNB introduced My Darling Judith (1987), The Affections of May (1990), The Motor Trade (1991), Wrong for Each Other (1992), and Office Hours (1996).

Other well-known plays include The Love List, The Long Weekend; Bedtime Stories; Kiss the Moon, Kiss the Sun; Storm Warning; Skin Flick; Outlaw; On a First Name Basis; Old Love; Mending Fences, Here on the Flight Path, The Foursome and The Ladies Foursome. Frequently compared with US playwright Neil Simon, Foster pens plays that are known for their humour, accessibility, and insight into the everyday tribulations of life. His work is frequently produced by theatre groups across North America, and as far away as Australia and New Zealand.
