

Last seen on stage in Dolphin's production of *Ocean Star* earlier this year, Richard is wondering why he is suddenly being cast as the father of troubled children. Since then, she has focused on sound and lighting design, on shows such as Around the World in 80 Days, Wait Until Dark, A Murder Is Announced, Home, I'm Darling, Shepherd, The Maltese Falcon, The Girl on the Train, Dead Simple, and Dial M For Murder. Nicole's role in Things I Know To Be True is a very important personal story, making it a perfect fit for her return to the boards.



#### **BENJAMIN WICKERS**

This is Benjamin's second show with Howick Little Theatre after completing his season of *Grand Horizons* earlier this year. His other credits include *Kimberly Akimbo* (Dolphin, 2023) and *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* (Company Theatre, 2024). Outside of theatre, Benjamin is working towards a creative writing and journalism degree, while dedicating free time to novel and playwriting. This is Benjamin's second collaboration with Emma Love as director, and he can't wait to bring yet another fantastic production to Auckland audiences.



#### **EVE DEPLEDGE**

#### **Rosie Price**

Things I Know to be True marks Eve's debut performance at Howick Little Theatre. By day, she balances being a Bachelor of Arts student at the University of Auckland and tutoring children's performing arts classes. Although she is new to HLT, Eve has been involved with acting as long as she can remember. Her experience includes performing in productions such as The Crucible, competing in Sheilah Winn Shakespeare, and various acting training, including completing a summer intensive acting program at NYCDA in New York in 2023. Eve is thrilled to be playing Rosie and hopes you love watching the Price family as much as she does!















#### THE PLAY

A funny, honest account of life in the suburbs, where Fran and Bob Price have built a home, brought up four kids and still managed to keep their sense of humour. It should now be time for them to stop and smell Bob's precious roses. But just when things look like slowing down, the lives of their wildly complicated adult children come crashing through the back door.

#### THE PLAYWRIGHT

#### **Andrew Bovell**

Andrew Bovell is an Australian playwright and screenwriter. He gained prominence with his play *Speaking in Tongues* (1996), which was later adapted into the award-winning film *Lantana* (2001). His original play *When the Rain Stops Falling* (2008) premiered as part of the Adelaide Festival of Arts and won both the Queensland Premier's Literary Award and the Victorian Premier's Literary Award.

Some of his other plays include *Things I Know To Be True* (Frantic Assembly and the State Theatre Company of South Australia, 2016); *The Secret River* (Sydney Theatre Company, 2013, Sydney Festival and 2016 national tour, winner of six Helpmann Awards including Best Play, as well as Best New Work Sydney Theatre Awards).

Andrew has adapted *Things I Know To Be True* into a miniseries for Matchbox/Amazon/Blossom Films for production this year. He is currently adapting *When the Rain Stops Falling* into an opera for Opera Australia, with music by Quentin Grant.

His screenwriting credits include the films A Most Wanted Man (2014), based on John Le Carré's novel, and Edge of Darkness (2010), directed by Martin Campbell and starring Mel Gibson and Ray Winstone. He also adapted Kate Grenville's novel The Secret River for the stage with the Sydney Theatre Company and later for a miniseries on ABC.

Bovell has received numerous awards throughout his career, including recognition from the Australian Writers' Guild and the Helpmann Awards. His writing often addresses complex human relationships, family dynamics, and societal issues, establishing him as a significant figure in contemporary Australian theatre and film.

His plays continue to be performed throughout Asia, the UK, the US and Europe.


