

He's enjoying reconnecting with Director Nathan Hey (previous encounter: *A Perfect Murder*, Winner HLT Best Production, 2016) and is comfortable increasing the average age of the *80 Days*' cast by several decades.

NAMRATA MANKAME-SHANBHAG

Namrata comes from a family of stage enthusiasts who set up productions during festivals back in India. Having grown up backstage (and sometimes on), she fell in love with theatre. She has returned to the stage as Sindhu Madhwani in Prayas' *Dhaba on Devon Avenue* at TAPAC (2022) and *Artworks*, Waiheke (2023). She then played Madanika and the Judge in their next production, *The Clay Cart* (2023). This is her first time performing at Howick Little Theatre in a stage adaptation of a literary classic and she hopes she does justice to her role

JAZMYN ASTILL

Jazmyn has been in the HLT theatre acting class since 2020 and is excited to make her second appearance on the stage since being a pundit in HLT's *The Book Club Play* in 2023. Miguel has been doing theatre for 11 years and is now acting in his second show at HLT - he was previously in A Christmas Carol. He has done productions for HCYT for most of his years and played The Big Bad Wolf in Shrek The Musical Jr as well as the Genie in Aladdin Jr. He recently played Mercutio in Romeo and Juliet. Still developing his acting career, Miguel is very excited to be a part of this show and has loved working with adult cast members.

MATTHEW PALMER

This is Matthew's second play at Howick Little Theatre, where he also attends drama classes. Since last year's Howick Little Plays, Matthew has been eager to get back on the stage in a large and ambitious play. THE PLAYWRIGHT

Laura Eason

Laura Eason is an Emmy-nominated producer, screenwriter and playwright. Currently, she is executive producer/showrunner of the Starz forthcoming drama series *Three Women*. Based on the non-fiction bestseller by Lisa Taddeo, the show stars Shailene Woodley, Betty Gilpin, DeWanda Wise and Gabrielle Creevy.



Her writing and producing credits for TV include the Showtime drama *The Loudest Voice* (WGA nomination; Golden Globe nomination, limited series) and four seasons of Netflix's fivetime Emmy-nominated best drama series *House of Cards* (Emmy and WGA nominations, drama series.) Laura's feature film debut, *Here and Now*, produced and starring Sarah Jessica Parker, premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival (then titled *Blue Night*) and is available on demand. Past and present TV development includes pilot scripts for Amazon, Apple, BBC, Fox 21, Fox Network and Starz.

An award-winning playwright, her more than 20 produced plays and adaptations include the original *Sex with Strangers*, which began at Steppenwolf in Chicago before playing Second Stage in NYC (NYT Critic's pick.) The play was one of the most produced in the US, with international productions in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, England, Finland, Greece, Luxembourg, Slovenia, Taiwan and Turkey. Laura's adaptation of *Jules Verne's Around the World in 80 Days* began under her direction in Chicago (seven Jeff Award nominations including Best Production and Best Adaptation) and went onto subsequent productions in London and 18 other UK cities before transferring to the New Victory Theatre in NYC (NYT Critic's pick.).

Laura served as Artistic Director of Lookingglass Theatre Company in Chicago (2011 Regional Theatre Tony Award) and is still a proud ensemble member, having worked as a writer, director, actor and/or producer on more than 20 productions to date. A thirdgeneration Chicagoan, she lives in Brooklyn with her family.
