They were last seen together on stage as spinster sisters in *Ladies in Lavender*. Classically trained through Actors Centre Australia, NIDA Open, and esteemed tutors, John returns to HLT after appearing as Joel Cairo in *The Maltese Falcon*. He's enjoying eking out the humour in the role, and feels humbled and privileged to be among such a stellar cast, director and support crew.

The theatre is a happy, creative outlet to contrast his day-to-day world, lubricating the wheels of commerce and industry at the BNZ. Barrie is dedicating his performance to his brother, who was sadly and suddenly taken during rehearsals.

Stephen is returning to the theatre having not performed since university days many centuries ago, in plays such as *As You Like It*, *Barefoot in the Park* and *The Seventh Seal*. The Playwright

LESLIE DARBON

A British playwright since the 1960s, Leslie Darbon has adapted two Agatha Christie novels for the stage. Her first (based on the novel *A Murder is Announced*) opened in 1977, and in 1981, her version of *Cards on the Table* premiered. Her other plays include: *Time To Kill* (2006), *A Cold Wind Blowing Up* (1983), *Correspondents' Course* (1976), *Double Edge* (1975) written with Peter Whelan, *Who Goes Bare?* (1974) written with Richard Harris, *Two And Two Make Sex* (1973) written with Richard Harris, *Dead On Time*,

Murder By Proxy, *Shadow Of Doubt*, and *The Spouse Girls*. For television, Leslie has written for *Crossroads*, *Moon And Son*, *Bergerac*, *Shoestring*, *The Adventurer*, *Jason King*, *Department S*, and *Suspense*.
