While characters were appropriate clothing and accessories that displayed their personality, and helped the audience to remember who they were.

My favourite part was how the murder was at its climax of being solved: Miss Marple in the room alone with the murderer who no one could have expected, delivering her facts and figures, and the murderer's manic response to being found guilty of the crime.
